- 6. Are the glitterati's life better for having their memories erased? What are the pros and cons of this procedure? If you could have your traumatic memories erased, would you? Why?
- 7. Should Simone and Georgie have been charged with the kidnapping of Louis/Lulu? Why?
- 8. Did the lawyers do the right thing in having a new jury brought in? Why?
